B.S.Yeddyurappa, the 75-year-old senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader, on 17th May 2018 was sworn in as the 23rd chief minister of Karnataka by Governor Vajubhai Vala. This is the third time that Yeddyurappa will be sworn in as Karnataka's chief minister. The first stint of Yeddyurappa barely lasted seven days from 12 November 2007 to 19 November 2007. The second was from 30 May 2009 to 4 August 2011.
